Python Coding Class

BCAUSEICAN successfully launched a (4) week, (8) session Python Coding Pilot program from July 9-July 30. Python is one of the leading coding languages in the IT industry today and used highly in Artificial Intelligence, Agile Framework Development and Cyber Security. The program was conducted for (11) students ranging from Middle to High School on a first come, first serve basis. It was a great opportunity to expose the students to such a powerful skillset. BCAUSEICAN received overwhelming responses to offer more Python classes this Fall and this is in progress.

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


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
